

I am a second semester ADN student, and my teachers recommended that all students get an NCLEX book and start practicing questions. I really like this book because it helps me to understand what type of questions to expect on the NCLEX and how to "break down" the questions and answers to figure out the best answer. The chapters are broken down into easy lessons with sample questions and rationales that clarify each concept. There are also 2 practice tests. I did sign up for

the online resources but just looked over them and have not had a chance to watch the DVDs or video tutorials. (I'm in nursing school, I have no time!) However, I intend to make use of these resources during school breaks. I try to spend about 15-20 minutes a day doing these practice lessons, and it is definitely helping me to better understand those mysterious NCLEX questions. You really have nothing to lose-- there is a money back guarantee if you don't pass the NCLEX (or if you don't find the book helpful). I highly recommend this book if you're in nursing school. Don't wait until a few weeks before the NCLEX-- start studying these questions now!

Any nursing student knows that you need to go through tons of sample NCLEX questions to prepare for the test. The Kaplan book certainly has plenty of those, and when you purchase the book, you may be tempted to just jump to the questions, but don't! The rest of the information is actually very helpful. It starts out reviewing the question style and format that is used on the NCLEX, so you can understand better the types of questions you will see, which is excellent groundwork. Beyond that, Kaplan outlines the major topics that you will see on the test, and gives a percentage with each topic reflecting how many questions you may encounter with the NCLEX. The topics include everything you'd expect: Management of Care, Safety, Psychosocial, Pharmacological, and of course many others. The suggestions for test-taking strategies and some generalized guidelines to follow are also incredible. The advice to follow Maslow's hierarchy of needs when deciding priority of action was life-saving for me! Also helpful, which is probably somewhat forgotten, is the information on what to do to apply for your test, how to get your results, and what to do to complete your licensure, both in your current location and in others, including international licensing. There is even contact information for the State Boards of Nursing in each state and a handy nursing terminology glossary in the back. Then, of course, there's the highlight which is probably the reason you're considering the book in the first place: the practice questions. There are 25 practice questions with each of the chapter topics, and full 265 question practice test. In the online access, there are also video tutorials, sample questions and another timed full-length practice test. It all adds up to over 600 practice questions. Ultimately, this is an excellent book, and a great resource for anyone getting ready to take the NCLEX. It certainly will not take the place of all of the studying you've been doing over the course of your nursing schooling, but it is one of the best test-aids out there. Kaplan is the name we've all heard for a reason. The one qualifier that I will make is that I personally feel that it isn't enough on its own. It is a perfect way to start your review, but once you're done, add on a second test book, or download one (or a few) of the many NCLEX practice apps out there. Follow that, and you'll feel much better prepared to pass that test and get your career started.

Highly recommend this book. I passed the NCLEX on my first try with 75 questions using this book as my main study tool. The test taking strategies explained in this book are on point. The two 265 question test with rational provide you with the greatest preparation for passing the NCLEX; the first time.

After graduating from school I starting doing the ATI studying course because my school used my tuition to pay for it. I did not like the course a couple weeks into it so I stopped it. I purchased this Kaplan book and the Hurst book. Both books talked about the same concepts but in a different manner. I spent a week using the Kaplan book to study and read the book from cover to cover. I took the NCLEX right after reading it. I had about 180 questions and passed the exam. The reason for my limited stars on this product is the amount of errors in the book. I found over 5 errors and I am sure I missed a couple. The errors were not huge, but when I am studying for such an important exam I expect the book to be accurate and checked over. The mistakes were discrepancies in the right answer. It said 2 different answers were right so I did not know which one was truly right so I throughout the questions. The book helped on the exam but it made me nervous with the lack of proof reading and presence of errors. I began to wonder if many of the questions had the wrong answers.

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
